They are back in school! On January 10, 2022, all schools reopened for classes. Our excitement was mixed with apprehension when the government confirmed the reopening barely two weeks prior to the day. Thankfully, we had been preparing, but we were not prepared for all the new requirements and challenges of teacher shortages.

All students in the country are back in school

The school is up and running. We started with 55 children in the first week, but currently we have 360 children (183 boys and 177 girls). 51 children are in the boarding section. We are expecting more children to report in the coming weeks.

Children returned when they had overgrown their uniforms.

- We had few teenage pregnancies, and a young schoolboy was forced to marry!
- Teacher shortages was countrywide many teachers left the profession to start their businesses while others went to better paying schools. Five of our teachers did not return to teaching.
- There is an increase in children with special needs mostly suffering malnutrition, poor sight, and hearing problems.

2020 Student and Teacher Holiday Support

The children who attended the holiday program are doing much better. Thank you for the support and encouragement during this challenging season. The program cost \$1,160 and it helped 76 children over a period of two months. The teachers are working hard to cover what the children missed because all children in the country were automatically promoted to the next class.

OTHER AREAS UNDER CONSIDERATION

Teacher Retention:

January 10, 2022, was a rude awakening for our staffing needs. The pandemic resulted in nationwide shortage of teachers. Many of them abandoned the profession. When we lost a new teacher who reported for less that a week to another school willing to pay a better pay, we realized the need for teacher retention strategy. We need to work on both living wages and additional accommodation.

Boosting the Solar Power:

We have been adding more solar power in the school, but we need a whole school approach. Our boarding section has grown, and we have more staff members in the school. This has created a challenge as the solar power does not last for long periods to help children increase time spent studying at night, charge laptops or the school printer.

The inclement weather limits the electricity produced by solar energy. On cloudy days, no solar power is generated. If we have large size solar batteries and panels, they will enable us to have reliable solar power.

We need to boost solar power in the library, classrooms, dormitories, and the office. We also need to install solar power in the dining hall, the kitchen and other school buildings.

School playground equipment:

The current playground equipment was donated in 2014 when we had fewer children. Much of the equipment is in a state of disrepair due to overuse. As we do not have a lot of space, we need to have the equipment for the children in a small area.

A playground helps children build their gross motor skills and development of key cognitive, social, and physical skills. It improves attention, decreases stress and anxiety, and prepares students to learn. Providing the right equipment is beneficial to children since it keeps them fit and healthy.

Additional Dormitories for Girls and Boys:

In the context of Nakyere village, the boarding section for girls is to help them to complete their studies. Girls face great pressure at home which interferes with school attendance and focus on studies. A boarding section provides a safer learning environment and sets a clear structure to keep the students focused on their studies.

We also have children who travel long distances to come to school. Children from far may be hindered from attending school when it rains heavily and their paths are impassable, during droughts when their bodies are weak from not having enough to eat and fatigue.


