

The children of the Amazing Love School have embarked upon the second term, which runs from May 29th until August 25th. The students have planted a school garden, which includes cassava, sweet potatoes, beans and other garden greens. These will be harvested in August and will contribute to the nutrition program while simultaneously educating the children in agricultural techniques.

Our current projects at a glance ...



ALDO Nutrition Program:

School feeding is part of ALDO's strategy to address children's hunger. Children's health and nutrition when combined with quality education can increase cognition, improve school attendance, ability to learn, and overall education attainment. ALDO has adopted a community-based gardening program in combination with a nutritional education component to improve children's food consumption. Our goals are:

- Provide food from the six group including carbohydrates, legumes, fortified oils, vegetables, fruits, and proteins.
- Work with partners to sponsor meals for children at a cost about \$280 per child per year to provide a balanced diet.
- Get quotes for the purchase of land and for building a granary.

Girls' Empowerment Project:

ALDO would like to construct a safe and gender-sensitive dormitory to accommodate the girls from the community. A school dormitory helps girls to focus on their education in a supportive environment with fewer distractions and provides security for the girls to develop life skills such as time management, work ethics, and responsibility. Investing in girls is one of the best investments to help end poverty while unleashing the potential of girls and women. Educated girls are empowered with opportunity to reduce poverty, inequality, violence, and they are more likely to ensure the education of their children. ALDO believes that girls' education can transform the entire community.


